Below are the results of a three-day poll of likely voters in the state of Michigan. Results are based on telephone interviews with 700 Republican primary voters in Michigan, aged 18+, and conducted January 4-6, 2008. The margin of sampling error is ± 4 percentage points.

1. For the 2008 Republican Presidential Nomination whom would you support? (Republicans Only)

John McCain 29%
Mitt Romney 20%
Mike Huckabee 18%
Rudy Giuliani 13%
Fred Thompson 5%
Ron Paul 5%
Duncan Hunter 1%
Undecided 9%

2. How important is it for the Republican presidential candidate to be a conservative Republican in the mode of Ronald Reagan, very important, somewhat important, not very important, not important, or undecided? (Republicans Only)

Very Important 45%
Somewhat Important 16%
Not Very Important 5%
Not Important 15%
Undecided 19%

3. How likely do you think it is that you will change your choice on whom you will vote for before the primary?

Very likely 23%
Somewhat likely 35%
Choice is definite 29%
Undecided 13%

4. Do you prefer a candidate who has experience in office or one who represents change?
